It's that time of year again! We are excited to be hosting our annual **Open House** on **Thursday**, **February 18th from 6:30 to 8:30**. We encourage all students and parents from grade 8 to 11 to attend.

At 6:30, there will be a presentation in the theatre, for students and their families, after which everyone is invited to explore the school, to enjoy the treats and displays, and to ask questions. Throughout the evening Mr. Phipps will be available in the main computer lab on the second floor to help with the course selection process.

Course selection for the 2016-2017 school year will take place in late February and March. It is important that their choices be based on Ministry requirements, individual interests and abilities, and future goals. Our Open House is organized to showcase the courses offered at EMCS, and to help students and parents make informed choices at each grade level, beginning with the transitions from Journey to EMCS. Teachers, counsellors, case managers, and administrators will be in attendance to answer questions and to make recommendations.

Students have been reminded to turn in their Career Cruising consent forms so they will be able to select courses online. Consent forms have been emailed home and are also available in the office. Using Career Cruising, each student creates a 4 year high school plan. Based on this plan, the program provides a personalized list of post-secondary options to explore.

School Counsellors have started course selection meetings with Grade 8 students at Journey. Career Cruising accounts are set up for Grade 8 students and Grade 8 students may now select their courses online. Starting on February 19, Grade 8 students will be able to lock-in their requests by clicking the "submit" button in the course selection window of Career Cruising.

Career Cruising accounts are not yet set up for current Grade 9-11 students. We plan to have these accounts set up near the end of February. At that time, school counsellors will meet with Grade 9-11 students to review grad requirements and explain the course selection process.

Math and Science Tutoring - Free tutoring for all levels of math and science (up to grade 11) is offered every Thursday after school in the counselling suite. No appointment necessary.

TEAC applications are now available for the September 2016 intake. TEAC 105 provides an introduction to careers and basic skills in Computer Science, Electronic and Computer Engineering Technology, Civil Engineering Technology, and Mechanical Engineering Technology. Students will complete a project in each of the 4 areas. Students also earn 4 college credits. This course takes place at Camosun College Interurban Campus, Fridays from 3:00pm to 6:00pm. This course is open to Grades 10 to 12 students who have a strong academic interest in engineering and computers sciences.

Math Opportunity - As our school continues to develop a community of academic rigor, we're happy to announce we are launching "Math and Computing Contests at EMCS".

We wish to inspire our students to develop an interest in and love for mathematics and computer science.
