Transition and the course selection process is in progress with Grade 8s, and just about to get started with grades 9-11. While it seems like we just began Octa 4, we are already just 3 weeks away from starting Octa 5. At EMCS, we value the experience of being outdoors and learning in a deep, project-based manner. The Science Department offers three amazing programs that allow students to take advantage of the wonderful local environment that surrounds Sooke: <a href="ECO Academy">ECO Academy</a>, Marine Biology and Environmental Science/Outdoor Education!

In Grade 9, students study:

- Science 9 or Sciences 9 (French Immersion) or Science 9 ECO Academy
- Mathematics 9
- Students also have the option of studying **Introductory Mathematics 9** if they feel they need extra confidence before moving into Mathematics 9.
- Marine Biology is also available as an elective!

In Grade 10, students study:

- Science 10 or Sciences 10 (French Immersion) or Science 10 ECO Academy
- Foundations of Mathematics and Pre-Calculus 10 or Workplace Mathematics 10
- Marine Biology is also available as an elective!

In Grade 11 and 12, students must study at least one of the following sciences. Students can choose as many as they like! Many Post-Secondary programs require more than 1 science course.

- Chemistry 11, Chemistry 12
- Environmental Science 11 / Outdoor Education 12 An exciting hands-on program!
- Life Sciences 11, Anatomy and Physiology 12
- Physics 11, Physics 12
- Science for Citizens 11

In Grade 11 and 12, students must study at least one of the following mathematics courses. Students are encouraged to study mathematics to the grade 12 level.

- Workplace Mathematics 11
- Foundations of Mathematics 11
- Pre-Calculus 11, Pre-Calculus 12
- Calculus 12
- Calculus 12 Dual Credit Dual credit courses offer both high school and post-secondary credits.

## Grade 10 Assessments

In order to graduate, students are now required to write two provincial assessments in grade 10: a *Literacy Assessment* and a *Numeracy Assessment*. The Literacy Assessment 12 is postponed this year.

So, *ALL* grade 10 students will write a Literacy and Numeracy Assessment this year. They will do so in windows: January 25 - 29, April 12 -16, and June 14-23. Students will write these assessments with their Science 10 (Numeracy) and Social Studies 11 (Literacy) classes. Grade 11 students that did not write their Numeracy and Literacy Assessment in Spring 2020 will also be scheduled to write their Assessments this year.
