- To be determined: Semester system, quarter system, octa system



- To boost skills before taking Math 9
- Takes an "elective" spot in your schedule
- Is Intro Math for you?Talk to your teacher.



### French 9


- not required but may be a good idea
- second language to the Grade 11 level is required for direct entry into UBC and SFU for <u>all</u> programs
- second language may be required for entry into some programs at other universities
- French 9 is recommended if you are doing well and enjoy French.



# Spanish 9

- not required but may be a good idea
- no previous experience in Spanish is required
- Spanish 11 meets the second language 11 requirement for direct entry into UBC and SFU.




### **Sample Course Description**

#### SUSTAINABILITY 10 (YRNR-0A)

In this course, students will begin to explore the connections between sustainable lifestyle choices, self-sufficiency, healthy food systems, and sustainable local and global communities. Students will be involved in a combination of research, projects, seed to table gardening, sustainability labs, and discussions. The EMCS school garden, greenhouse, and orchard will be highly integrated in to this course, and students will connect with local food producers. Hands-on learning will focus on collaborative cooking, baking, and horticulture as these trades are introduced.
