THIS WEEK'S DEPARTMENT FEATURES: Languages & English



Languages are a key part of a balanced educational program. All students study **English** in Grades 9 through 12 while they are at EMCS. About 10% of our school population is also engaged in studying a rich **French Immersion** program. We encourage all students to challenge themselves by including **French** and/or **Spanish** in their course planning. Language learning has a wide range of cognitive benefits! Many Post-Secondary institutions, including UBC and SFU, actually require students study an additional language to apply to their programs.

French Immersion students study the following course as part of their overall program:

- Grade 9: Sciences, Français Langue, Sciences Humaines, Éducation à la carrière
- Grade 9: Sciences, Français Langue, Sciences Humaines, Éducation à la carrière
- Grade 11: Langue et Culture de la Francophonie, Explorations en Sciences Humaines
- Grade 12: Français Langue (required), AP French 12 Évaluation de littératie.
