## Is your child interested in the TASK program for semester two?

TASK is an acronym for *Trades Awareness, Skills and Knowledge*. The program is offered in partnership with Camosun College. Students are introduced to various construction and mechanical trades, gain entry level industry certificates and earn up to 16 school credits, including Trades Math 11, plus 8 Camosun college credits! Work experience is a key component of TASK, a component which may lead to a paid job and/or apprenticeship. It is a cohort program where students spend their entire school semester with their TASK class.
