#### **EMCS Grad List**

Important information regarding distance learning courses (online, paper package courses)

One of the requirements for getting on the EMCS Grad List is that any distance learning (e.g. WestShore, SIDES) courses that are required for meeting BC grad requirements must be completed by the beginning of May. Also, please be aware that many universities require that distance learning courses be completed (and final mark issued) well before the end of the school year. This deadline varies among post-secondary schools.
