# Introduction to Guitar 9, 10, 11, 12

No experience necessary. Description: This is an introductory course for Grade 9-12 students, although is open to students who have experience playing guitar. A step-by-step method. Starting with the basics, students will learn chords, scales, popular riffs, theory, strumming patterns, finger picking, note reading, symbols and technical terms, rhythm, maintenance and ear training.
