



ROTARY CLUB OF SOOKE SCHOLARSHIP

INFORMATION

The Rotary Club of Sooke offers three annual scholarships of \$2000 to students graduating from Grade 12 and living in Sooke. The Stewart Youngson Academic Scholarship is for students entering a degree program at a recognized¹ university or college. The Faith Jacobsen Vocational Scholarship is for students entering a technical program at a recognized college, university or trade institute. The Jane Thomson Memorial Bursary is to provide financial support to a student pursuing a trade or apprenticeship program. The scholarships are awarded following proof of registration with \$1000 paid in the first year and a further \$1000 paid on successful completion of first year and on proof of registration in second year. The scholarship must be initiated within 24 months from the time of being awarded.

Eligibility

1. Applicants are residents of Sooke.
2. Academic Standing:
 - a. For the Stewart Youngson Academic Scholarship, candidates will have maintained a consistently strong academic standing through Grades 11 and 12 (GPA 3.5+).
 - b. For the Faith Jacobsen Vocational Scholarship, candidates will have maintained an excellent academic standing in subjects related to their chosen field.
 - c. For the Jane Thomson Memorial Bursary, candidates must demonstrate a financial need and a commitment of a valid trade or apprenticeship program in B.C.
3. In order to qualify for either scholarship, the applicant must:
 - Demonstrate leadership abilities through participation in extra curricular activities and community service
 - Demonstrate the relationship between their qualifications and personal or career goals and the Object of Rotary².
 - Provide reference letters from a teacher to support their academic qualifications and from a community service organization
 - Provide a cover letter that speaks to their career goals and their qualifications for this scholarship/bursary.
 - The handwritten application must be submitted by the **FIRST MONDAY OF MAY** of each year to the counsellor at Edward Milne Community School or to the Rotary Club of Sooke at P.O. Box 515.

4. An official secondary transcript of your Grade 11 marks and all marks assigned during the Grade 12 year up to and including the last report card.
