Track and Field

The EMCS Track & Field Team had a remarkable 2022 season, topped off with a podium finish at the BC Track & Field Championships. With a very strong team this year, led by Ashton Fowler, Keanu Kanealii, and Yu Okaniwa, EMCS went into the Island Championships with some of the top ranked sprinters and hurdles on the island. These athletes dominated on the track at the Island Championships with all 3 of them making it to their respective Finals, and Ashton and Keanu qualifying in the top 3 and earning spots to the BC Provincial Championships. Ashton Fowler qualified in the 100m and 200m sprints, and Keanu Kanealii qualified in the 100m Hurdles. Yu Okaniwa missed qualifying for the Provincial Championships by just 1.5 seconds in the 400m. In an extremely sad turn of events, Ashton injured his hamstring before the BC Championships and was not able to compete. On the bright side, he is only in grade 11 and will have another shot next year to become the fastest high school student in the province. Keanu Kanealii on the other hand, arrived in Langley ready to represent EMCS against the best in province. Keanu entered the BC Championships with the 12th best time (16.85 seconds). Keanu destroyed his personal best time in the heats, running a season best time and placing himself in the 100m Hurdles Final! Keanu ran a time of 16.13 seconds at the BC Championships making him the 5th fastest Junior hurdling in the province! For the first time since 2014, EMCS was on the podium at the BC Track & Field Championships. EMCS Head Track & Field Coach, Zac Vine, stated "this team worked extremely hard, training for 4 months, and in my 12 years of coaching I have never been prouder of a group of student-athletes."

Grade 12 Updates!

GRADE 12 STUDENTS STARTING AT UVIC IN SEPT:

Academic advising is now available for admitted students. UVic encourages students to book a meeting with their faculty's academic adviser(s) as soon as possible. This is a busy time of year for Academic Advising and availability is limited. Admitted students can find their appropriate academic adviser on the Undergraduate academic advisers webpage.

Student Transcripts Service (STS) - Post-Secondary Institution Selections

Grade 12 students can now make their post-secondary institution (PSI) selections in the StudentTranscripts Service (STS). How and when transcript information is sent will depend on the PSI

and the options selected in STS. For full details, please visit the <u>Transcripts and Post-Secondary Selection</u> web page.



Grade 12 students can make up to 25 free PSI

selections in STS. They are also entitled to order one free printed transcript (by mail) after graduation, which can be sent to any address they choose. All other transcript orders in STS (including <u>PDF transcripts</u>) are \$10 each.

Important Reminder about Authorizing Select PSIs to Retrieve Transcripts Updates - If a student's selected PSI is capable of receiving ongoing electronic updates (i.e., XML transcripts), the student should choose the second option to "Send my transcript now and allow this Post-Secondary Institution to request transcript updates until the date specified below." To ensure there are no issues with their PSI application process, it is also recommended that they leave the authorization period set to the default date of one year.
