## Halloween Costume Guidelines on October 31

We know that for many of you Halloween is a fun and exciting time. To keep our celebrations fun for all, we ask our students to ensure that their costume follows District guidelines (if you are wearing it to school on October 31<sup>st</sup>).

The District does not have an official policy regarding Halloween costumes, instead we ask that everyone be respectful and mindful of others by following the guidelines below.

- 1. Students must be identifiable and visible to ensure safety.
- 2. Masks are not permitted. Face makeup is permitted as long as the student is still identifiable.
- 3. Scary clowns are not permitted.
- 4. Costumes that depict violence, alcohol or drugs are not appropriate.
- 5. Fake weapons are not permitted.

6. Costumes that are provocative, sexual in nature or employ questionable props are not permitted.

Costumes should not hinder a student's ability to travel through the school and outdoor space safely.

Please remember that inappropriate costumes, even with good intent, may make others feel scared, upset, insulted or humiliated. Let's create a safe and enjoyable environment for all.

# **Poinsettias for Sale**


Skills for Life is excited to be selling beautiful poinsettias, wreaths and greenery for the upcoming holidays.

### **November**

- Check for the updated list of <u>post-secondary info sessions</u> taking place.
- TBD: Purdy's fundraising closes.
- Nov. 10: Capstone Activity Log #1 AND Mentor Notes #1 are due.
- First draft of your scholarship/bursary letter of application should be done.
- Transcript Verification Report: This report will be mailed home in late November or early December. The report contains your demographic information as well as completed courses, credits, and courses in progress. Ensure all information is accurate. See your School Counsellor if there are any errors on the report. The name on the TVR will be as it appears on your high school diploma which will be mailed to the address listed in the summer following graduation.
- If you failed a Quarter 1 course, this may impact your ability to graduate and/or be admitted to post-secondary programs. See your School Counsellor if you have questions.
