# **January Timeline**

- If you failed a Semester 1 course, this may impact your ability to graduate and/or be admitted to post- secondary programs. See your School Counsellor if you have questions.
- If you are planning to apply for student housing, application usually starts now.
- February 14 to 16, 2024: Grad Photo retakes
- February 26, 2024: Capstone project preview sessions start today and go until March 1

Make sure you are on track to graduate at the end of your Grade 12 year! Double check your timetable to make sure you are scheduled for the courses you need to graduate. If you aren't sure, make an appointment to see your Counsellor.
