





Course Selection

- The school schedule is built based on your requests.
- Select courses carefully.
- Read course descriptions first.
- Talk to teachers and your counsellor if you have questions.
- Changes in September are <u>very</u> difficult to make and will be considered only in special situations.

Do NOT...

• Do <u>NOT</u> sign up for an elective you've already taken.

• <u>Example</u>: Food Studies in Grade 9 = Food Studies <u>10</u>.

• "Skills Exploration" courses...

Example:

Skills Exploration 10A: Wood = Woodwork 10 Skills Exploration 11A: Foods = Food Studies 11



BEPREPARED

Prerequisites

- Plan to take Grade 11 electives <u>BEFORE</u> Grade 12 electives. (exception: Art Metal and Jewellery 12)
- Prerequisites exist for most academic subjects.
 E.g. Chem 11 <u>BEFORE</u> Chem 12
- Prerequisites are included in the course descriptions in myBlueprint.

• No pre-requisites for <u>Grade 10 students</u> for:

- Most Grade 10 electives

To request a Grade 11 elective in Grade 10, you must have completed the corresponding Grade 10 version.

Prerequisites

- No pre-requisites for **Grade 11 and 12** students for:
 - Most Grade 11 electives
 - Art Metal & Jewellery 12
 - Grade 12 Social Studies courses
 - Work Experience 12A



Can I take a Grade 11 course in Grade 10?

Yes, <u>IF</u> you have taken the corresponding Grade 10 course.

Examples:

- Woodwork 10 BEFORE Woodwork 11
- Textiles 10 BEFORE Textiles 11

Did Drama 10 in Grade 9?

In Grade 10, take

Drama: Theatre Company 10 (Advanced Drama 10)



Co-requisites

A course you MUST take in the same year

Co-requisites are listed in myBlueprint



Failed a Course?

- If you failed a Grade 10, or 11 required course: you must repeat it.
- Summer School may be an option for Grade 10-12 courses.
- Grade 9 repeats....
 If you got an "F" in English, Science, Socials, or Math 9.

- Planning for Grade 10: Have your Grade 9 schedule in front of you. Remember, most of your electives in Grade 9 are GRADE 10 electives. You can't get credit for the same course twice. Those courses/credits will show up in your Gr. 10 column next year.
- **Planning for Grade 11:** The Grade 10 electives you took in Grade 9 will show up in your Grade 10 column.



Researching Post-Secondary Options





Bachelor's Degree

- 4 years
- also called an "undergraduate degree"
- e.g. BA(History), BEd., BEng, BSc (Biochemistry)

Master's Degree


- +2 years after a Bachelor's Degree
- a "graduate degree"
- e.g. MSc (Chemistry), MSW, MEd (Counselling)

Doctoral Degree

- +3 years after a Master's Degree
- a "graduate degree"
- e.g. PhD (English), PhD (Psychology), EdD
- Gives you the title "Doctor"



"major"



Certificate

- 1 year or less
- e.g. Office Administration, Certified Dental Assistant, Health Care Assistant

Diploma

- 2 years
- e.g. Massage Therapy, Indigenous Studies, Visual Arts



University Transfer Program

 Doing 1 or 2 years of university level courses then transferring to a university to finish a Bachelor's Degree.

College (continued)

Associate Degree

- 2 years of specific university transfer courses
- e.g. Assoc. of Science (Biology)

some Bachelor's Degrees

- 4 years
- E.g. BBA (Accounting), BSN (nursing)



Trades Training

- various length
- e.g. Welding Foundation Certificate, Automotive Service Technician Certificate, Professional Cook Level 1
- Followed by on-the-job training (Apprenticeship)

Technical Institute

Examples: BCIT, NAIT, SAIT

- various high-tech programs, business, trades, applied sciences, engineering, computing / IT, health sciences, ...
- Applied & career-focused
- Certificates, Diplomas, Bachelor's Degrees, Master's Degrees

Examples of programs:

- Video Production & Editing Certificate
- Electrical Foundation Certificate (trades)
- Computer Information Technology Diploma
- Marine Engineering Diploma
- Diagnostic Medical Sonography Diploma
- Bachelor of Engineering (Civil)



Post-Secondary Admission Requirements

- Requirements are changing and vary from school to school <u>AND</u> program to program.
- Some schools are looking at Grade 11 marks, not just Grade 12
- Do your research carefully.
- No second language requirement.
- Consult your school counsellor.



Advice if you want to go to university

Take at least <u>5</u> "academic" Grade 12 courses.

Vary depending on school & program

Math: at least...
Pre-calc 11 or
Found of Math 11

Higher for UBC

Aim for at least 80 to 85% average....

Higher for some programs e.g. Nursing, Engineering

Camosun College "University Transfer" is a good option.

Can get into VIU, TRU, UNBC, ... with lower marks

Second Languages

- French 10, 11 & 12
- Introductory French 11
- Spanish 10, 11 & 12
- Introductory Spanish 11 (open to Gr. 10, 11, 12)

A second language is <u>not</u> needed for post-secondary admission.

- Superfit Strength & Conditioning 10
- Golf Skills 10

do not meet the PHE 10 graduation requirement

- Hockey and Soccer Academy
 - take up TWO spots in your schedule
 - Remember to register on the SD 62 Academies website too!
- Softball Academy
 - takes up only ONE spot in your schedule
 - Remember to register on the SD 62 Academies website too!

- Grade 10 12:
 - Culinary Arts 10A/B/C
 - Culinary Arts 11A/B/C
 - Culinary Arts 12A/B/C



- Grade 12:
 - Specialized Studies in Food 12 (Mr. Caryk's permission required... scaryk@sd62.bc.ca
- If you want to take multiple Culinary classes or work towards a career as a professional cook, see Mr. Caryk for advice regarding course selection.







Eco Academy

- Science 10ECO & Foods 10ECO
- Key themes: Eco-Literacy, Community, Experiential Learning, Global & Local Food Systems
- Rigorous classroom and lab work
- Inquiry, Collaboration, Self-Direction

An additional online registration is required for Academies. See EMCS website under "Departments.... Academies".



Metal TASK

Trades
Awareness
Skills &
Knowledge

- For Grade 11 & 12 students
- full semester trades program at EMCS (4 courses)
- partnership program with Camosun College
- includes a work experience placement



EMR 12 (Emergency Medical Responder)

- Open to Grade 11 & 12 students
- Partnership between SD62 and Justice Institute of BC
- You'll earn high school credits AND credits from JIBC.
- A good option for students interested in paramedic, fire/rescue, policing, health care, occupational first aid, etc.
- Does NOT meet the Science 11/12 requirement for graduation
- See Mr. Clark if you have questions.



South Island Partnership / Dual Credit

- Take a Camosun College course or program while in high school.
- Tuition is covered.
- Earn both high school credit AND college credit

Examples:

- Trades Foundation Programs (Automotive, Carpentry, Welding, Cook, etc.)
- Explorations in Technology course (TEAC 105)... Intro to Engineering
- Business Administration Certificate
- Education Assistant & Community Support Worker Certificate
- Office Administration Certificate
- Computer Network Tech Certificate
- And more!



See your Counsellor. May make sense to plan English 12 in Grade 11 year (or summer school).


Selecting Your Courses
