



Food Studies in Grade 9 = Food Studies 10.




BE PREPARED



Prerequisites

- Plan to take Grade 11 electives **BEFORE** Grade 12 electives. (exception: Art Metal and Jewellery 12)
- Prerequisites exist for most academic subjects. E.g. Chem 11 **BEFORE** Chem 12
- Prerequisites are included in the course descriptions in myBlueprint.

Prerequisites

- **No pre-requisites for Grade 10 students for:**

- Most Grade 10 electives

To request a Grade 11 elective in Grade 10, you must have completed the corresponding Grade 10 version.

- **No pre-requisites for Grade 11 and 12 students for:**

- Most Grade 11 electives
- Art Metal & Jewellery 12
- Grade 12 Social Studies courses
- Work Experience 12A



Can I take a Grade 11 course in Grade 10?

- Yes, **IF** you have taken the corresponding Grade 10 course.



Failed a Course?

- If you failed a Grade 10, or 11 required course:

- **Summer School** may be an option for Grade 10-12 courses.


Post-Secondary Application Process

University

Bachelor's Degree

- 4 years
- also called an **“undergraduate degree”**
- e.g. BA(History), BEd., BEng, BSc (Biochemistry)

“major”



Master's Degree

- +2 years after a Bachelor's Degree
- a **“graduate degree”**
- e.g. MSc (Chemistry), MSW, MEd (Counselling)



University
of Victoria

Doctoral Degree

- +3 years after a Master's Degree
- a **“graduate degree”**
- e.g. PhD (English), PhD (Psychology), EdD
- Gives you the title **“Doctor”**

College

Certificate

- 1 year or less
- e.g. Office Administration, Certified Dental Assistant, Health Care Assistant

Diploma

- 2 years
- e.g. Massage Therapy, Indigenous Studies, Visual Arts

University Transfer Program

- 1 or 2 years of university level courses
- then transfer to a university to finish a Bachelor's Degree.



College *(continued)*

Associate Degree

- 2 years of specific university transfer courses
- e.g. Assoc. of Science (Biology)

some Bachelor's Degrees

- 4 years
- E.g. BBA (Accounting), BSN (nursing)



Trades Training

- various length
- e.g. Welding Foundation Certificate, Automotive Service Technician Certificate, Professional Cook Level 1
- Followed by on-the-job training (Apprenticeship)

Technical Institute

Examples: BCIT, NAIT, SAIT

- various high-tech programs, business, trades, applied sciences, engineering, computing / IT, health sciences, ...
- Applied & career-focused
- Certificates, Diplomas, Bachelor's Degrees, Master's Degrees

Examples of programs:

- Video Production & Editing Certificate
- Electrical Foundation Certificate (trades)
- Computer Information Technology Diploma
- Marine Engineering Diploma
- Diagnostic Medical Sonography Diploma
- Bachelor of Engineering (Civil)




Post- Secondary Admission Requirements

- Requirements are changing and vary from school to school AND program to program.
- Some schools are looking at Grade 11 marks, not just Grade 12
- Do your research carefully.
- No second language requirement.
- Consult your school counsellor.

Trades Awareness Skills & Knowledge

- For Grade 11 & 12 students
- full semester trades program at EMCS (4 + courses)
- partnership program with Camosun College
- includes a work experience placement



EMR 12 (Emergency Medical Responder)

- Open to Grade 12 students (and exceptional Gr. 11 students)
- Earn your EMR certification.
- A good option for students interested in paramedic, fire/rescue, policing, health care, occupational first aid, etc.
- Does NOT meet the Science 11/12 requirement for graduation
- See Mr. Clark if you have questions.



Health Career Sampler Program



- Semester 2 of your Grade 12 year
- Pre-requisites: English 12, Life Sciences 11 / Chemistry 11
- 20 credits (5 courses) including: CLC12, Anatomy & Physiology 12, Work Experience 12A, Health Career Sampler 12, Allied Health 12, ...
- Dual Credit program: partnership with Camosun College, Royal Roads University, Justice Institute of BC
- Earn both high school & college credits
- Learn real-world skills and explore health career possibilities e.g. nursing, mental health support, medical lab work, ... and more!
- At the John Horgan Campus
- No cost
- See Ms. Moreland in the Careers Centre for more info and to apply

South Island Partnership / Dual Credit

- Take a Camosun College course or program while in high school.
- Tuition is covered.
- Earn both high school credit AND college credit

Examples:

Top 5 Mistakes

1. Picking courses without reading descriptions.
2. Re-selecting courses you already have credit for.
3. Choosing alternates you don't actually want.
4. Assuming schedules can be easily changed in September.
5. Not submitting your course requests.



Straight from the Course Change Form

(These students were given the courses they requested.)



- *“The course I chose wasn’t what I thought it was.”*
- *“I thought it was something else.”*
- *“I already know how to cook.”*

- *“I am no longer interested in this course.”*
- *“Not interested in Art.”*
- *“I don’t like the class.”*


